
Our Hope volleyball team this year had five seniors. Each of them showing leadership on and off the court. They were always ready to fight their hardest until the very end of a game.

 providers, and allow pharmaceutical (drug)
 companies outside of the country to
 compete in the drug industry and increase
 competition.

Economy:

- Hillary Clinton wants to help the economy by creating jobs with a big government investment in infrastructure, such as constructions on roads, buildings, and bridges. She also wants all public universities to be debt free, increase taxes on the rich, and raise the minimum wage.
 Again, increasing the Federal Government by a large margin.
- Donald Trump believes that closing tax loopholes that large business are able to use, such as carried interest, will help keep our economy going, and helps jobs to stay in America.

He wants a major tax deduction for all classes, and to allow all families to deduct the average cost of childcare from their taxes. His tax cuts, unfortunately, seem unrealistic, with our country's debt being doubled in the last four years

Terrorism

- Hillary Clinton has plans to keep fighting terrorists in the Middle East with airstrikes and continue helping our allies.
- Donald Trump has limited what he says about defeating terrorists, especially Isis. Saying things along the lines of how he doesn't want to announce to the terrorists how we are going to defeat them, before we defeat them. It almost defeats the purpose.

Immigration

- Hillary wants to make it easier for illegal immigrants to get citizenship, saying she doesn't want to "split up families". In a speech she gave that was leaked by Wikileaks she tells those who were listening that her dream is an open hemisphere, with open borders, though she claims that she was not talking about immigration and illegal aliens.
- Donald Trump wants to deport hundreds of illegal aliens getting them outside of America. He wants to make the process of becoming an American citizen easier for everyone, not just the illegal immigrants who have already come. He plans on getting rid of the Sanctuary Cities and building a wall on the Mexican border to replace the fences we now have.



Complete the crossword below




